President- Jane Kidner - Call to order Welcomes Executive

1.Motion to Approve the Minutes from Spring 2023

Introduction of Lee Simpson a representative from the Lake Simcoe South Shore Residents Association (LSSSRA)

Our activities over the summer since the last year we spoke to you - The initial plan was filed last year . 70 responses were given and the impact assessment agencies boiled it down to the following points to assess. There was supposed to be a 180 day window for them to file a detailed project plan. They had an option to opt out of that and they did opt out in June. They held an info session at the Sutton Library and it was not helpful. They said that they did not have to communicate their plans. They hired a company to make sure we are up to date with everything yet nothing has happened. Their strategy seems to be that they are hiding what their plans are. The environmental assessment may not be available to us until after they file the report. We have a gov't relations a communication firm to help us and we hope to require them to go through the appropriate complete environmental assessment. The fact that they are hiding information from us and not following the appropriate procedures may work against them. We are dealing with all levels of govt' but this is a federal matter so municipal and provincial governments are not able to help.

1. We want a full environmental assessment
2. Force a meaningful analysis of all the options.

Hatch is the company that built the ferry and disputes the argument that the ferry only has 2-3 years of useful life. The President stated their ferries in fresh waster have a shelf life of 50-65 years . This one was bought in 2000. Only 23 years old. According to our research, a suitable electric ferry bigger than the one they currently have will cost only 28 Million. Alternatively, the existing one can be retrofitted and converted to electric for just 12 million. Both of these options are significantly less expensive than the \$400 Million it will cost for the bridge. Yet they are not willing to discuss these options.

We need to gain control of the situation. Our strategy is to get into the federal gov't and educate them and the ministers about these issues and the credible options that are available. Once this is filed we need those who are making the decisions to be educated and aware of everything.

Questions

Q: Is a Casino going to be built on the island?

After speaking to Friday harbour we were told this is very unlikely if not impossible because they can not get water and sewage on the Island . If these are not addressed then a hotel can not be built. The only way this will work is that the town supplies it and delivers it. This is a "showstopper" just based on the sheer cost.

Dept of Transport funds the ferry. We are planning to talk to those folks as well.

Q: How are you getting funding for the work you are doing now and how can we help with that?

There is a small group of us that are personally funding this. We are all the most impacted by this. We are deliberately not going out to ask just yet. But we are not saying no to e-transfers. Q: When is the plan to build?

They want this running by Dec 2025 which means they want to start dumping rock this January. The bridge will 1.6 kilometres of rock and an 800 meter bridge that will be 65 feet to the peak.

We are trying to build good relationships to educate people and make sure that this will go through the whole environmental process. If we can hold off 2 years than we think we can achieve this.
